## Kindergarten Standards

### Language Arts

- **ELACCKRL2**: Key Ideas and Details: With prompting and support, with prompting and support, retell familiar stories, including key details

#### Science

#### Math

- MGSEK.G.5: Model shapes in the world by building shapes from components and drawing shapes

- MGSEK.MD.3: Classify object into given categories, count the numbers of objects in each category and sort the categories by count

- SSKG2: Explain that a map is a drawing of a place and a globe is a model of Earth
- **SSKE1**: Describe the work that people do such as: police officer, fire fighter, soldier, mail carrier, farmer, doctor, teacher, etc.
- SSKE2: Explain that people earn income by working
- SSKE3: Explain how money is used to purchase goods and services
- SSKE4: Explain that people must make choices because they cannot have everything they want
