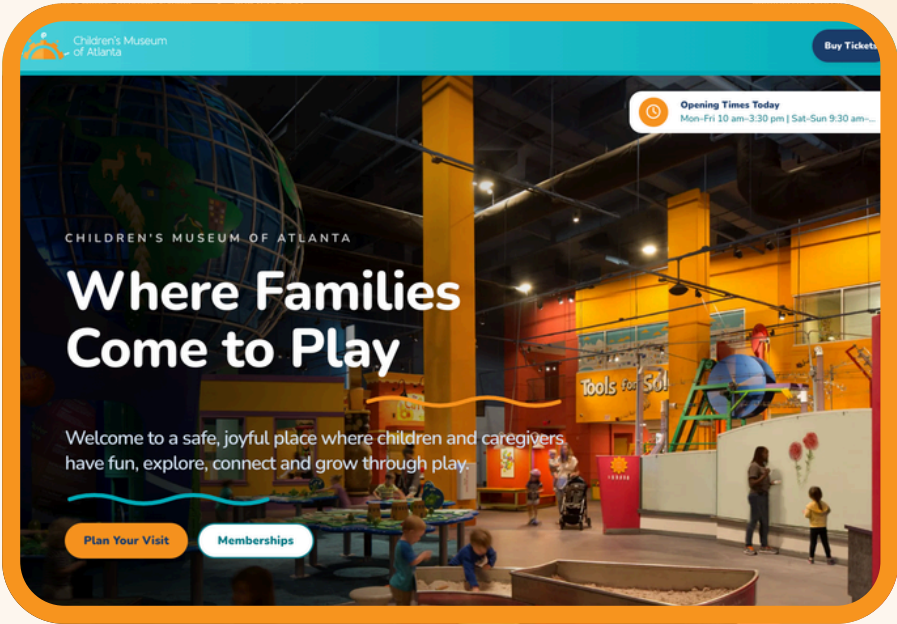
Social Narrative Story

I can view and shop the Museum Store. There are toys, snacks, games, and more.



I will scan my ticket at the security desk with a Museum staff member.

If I need a map, I can ask a Museum staff member at the Security desk, *"Can I borrow a Museum Map?"*

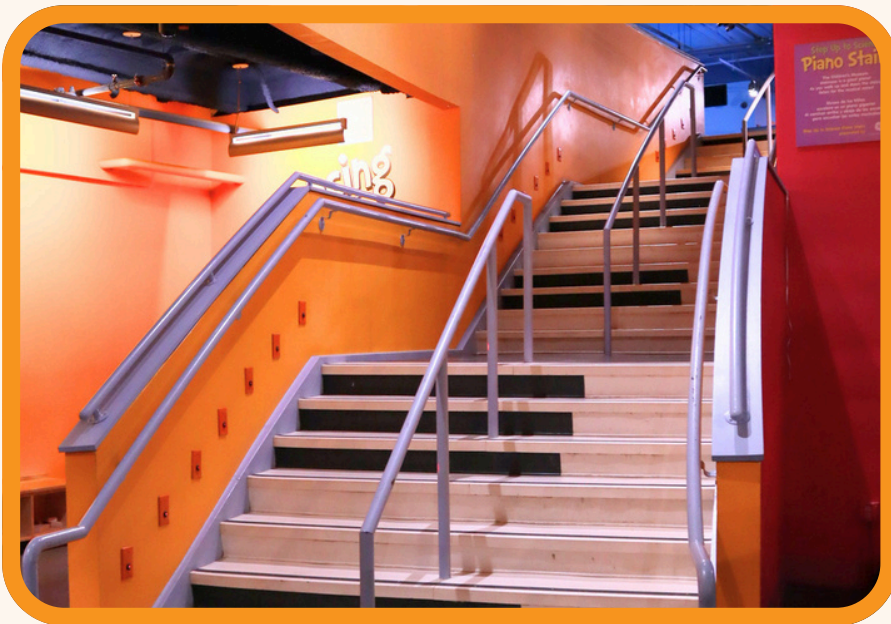


Bathrooms are located down the hallway next to the security Desk.

Private family bathrooms are located around the Museum.



The Museum has 6 permanent exhibits to explore and play in.



The Museum has 2 floors. I can use the piano stairs or the elevator located on the side of the Museum.



I can touch and play with things around the Museum.

I may have to share with other people.



I will need to locate the activity sheet sign-up at the Art Studio and Science Bar to participate in workshops.



In the Museum, I may hear loud noises and see a lot of visitors.



I can borrow a sensory pack in the Welcome Center. I can ask Museum staff, “*Can I borrow a sensory pack?*”

Inside a sensory pack, there are headphones, sunglasses and sensory toys.



I can visit the Quiet Room located towards the back of the Museum for some quiet time.

If someone else is using the Quiet Room, I may have to wait my turn.



I cannot have food on the Museum floor. If I need a snack break, I can visit the Snack Stop next to the Welcome Center.

I can purchase snacks and drinks inside the Museum Store.



If I need any help during my visit, I can talk to any Museum staff member wearing a Children's Museum of Atlanta t-shirt.



If I need to leave the building and re-enter, I can ask a Museum staff member at the security desk for a stamp.



If I borrowed a sensory pack or a Museum map, I should return it before I leave the Museum.



The Museum is big and there is a lot to explore and discover!

I may not have had a chance to play with everything, but I can come back and visit again!
