ANNUAL REPORT FY 2022



For Children's Museum of Atlanta, fiscal year 2022 was one of both rebuilding and growth. As in-person activities restarted, CMA provided a much-needed respite for parents who longed for their children to experience the world through play. In addition to our permanent learning zones, we welcomed three blockbuster exhibits to our space: *Thomas Edison's Secret Lab*, *Rube Goldberg: The World of Hilarious Invention*, and *Storyland: A Trip Through Childhood Favorites*. Each exhibit delighted and excited Atlanta's children, introducing them to science, innovation, creative problem-solving, art, literature, and much more.

In fiscal year 2022, CMA also invested in our children's future by introducing a renovated Step Up to Science to the city. Thanks to a generous gift from The Cognizant Foundation, CMA opened Step Up to Science: Cause and Effect and Step Up to Science: Engineering. The newly designed exhibits give kids hands-on opportunities to explore and play with the relationship between force and motion and the scientific principles underlying engineering.

In addition, Jane's Innovation Station brought design thinking to life as children used recycled materials to plan, create, test, and improve their creative solutions to big challenges.

We were delighted to welcome Atlanta artists back to our stage as we celebrated cultural holidays from around the world during our Celebrate! and United Nations of Play programs. Together we sang, danced, shared stories, and gave children from Atlanta's many communities space to joyfully learn from and with one another.

Beyond our walls, CMA was back in our community, bringing play-based learning to students living in under-resourced neighborhoods. For over a decade, Connected Learning... Connected Communities has been vital in supporting Atlanta's teachers and their students. In partnership with United Way of Greater Atlanta, CMA provided free access to kindergarten readiness programs in local libraries, churches, and community centers. And thanks to funding from the Institute of Museum and Library Services, CMA launched Distance Learning Across Communities, bringing virtual live, interactive STEAM workshops to classrooms in rural Georgia.

The 2022 fiscal year reestablished and expanded our crucial role in advancing early childhood development and community connection in Atlanta and beyond. Knowing that childhood is a period in time that can never be reclaimed – when imagination rules, when all things are possible, and when a great “day at work” is a day filled with play, experimentation, and invention -we are more committed than ever to ensure that CMA remains a strong presence and welcoming place for every young child and their family. Atlanta needs us. Our children need us.

LEARNING ZONES

As a thought leader in early childhood education, CMA expands the minds of children through play and tangible interactions, providing opportunities for them to explore the arts, world cultures, literacy, STEAM, geography, and more. CMA's six learning zones encourage children to freely play as they like while also providing them with activities and inspiration that are curriculum-directed and aligned with the knowledge they need to be successful in school.



GATEWAY TO THE WORLD

Travel the world right here at the Museum! Visit six of the world's continents and more in CMA's largest permanent exhibit.



TOOLS FOR SOLUTIONS

Move the balls through our giant ball machine using six simple machines. Learn how to attach make-believe wires and connect pipes in the Construction House. Create skyscrapers and design the city of the future with our city blocks. Test your structures with simulated earthquakes.



FUNDAMENTALLY FOOD

Choose vegetables and fruits from the farm, climb on our John Deere tractor, milk our milking cow, "Buttercup," load boxes on our delivery truck, and operate a fork lift. Shop 'til you drop in our grocery store. Enjoy a healthy pretend meal while at our play diner.



LET YOUR CREATIVITY FLOW

Release your inner artist at the paint wall. Visit the virtual reality sand table and create multi-colored topographic landscapes.



LEAPING INTO LEARNING

Enter a magical forest, cast your rods, catch colorful fish, and go under our waterfall without getting wet! Climb in our tree house and see animals from the forest. Babies and toddlers will love the play car. There is also a little house built just for them.



STEP UP TO SCIENCE

This recently updated Learning Zone currently features a rotating set of new exhibits, Cause and Effect. Designed to enhance children's STEAM understanding, it offers interactive opportunities for kids to explore the cause and effect relationships between force and motion.

STEP UP TO SCIENCE - CAUSE & EFFECT

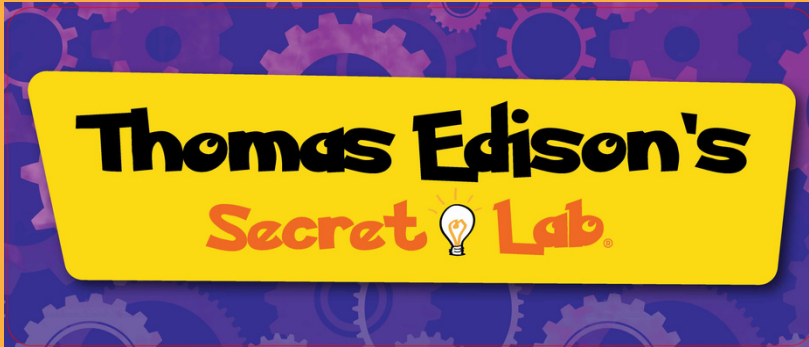
This past year, CMA completed Phase II of our Step Up to Science renovation adding Cause & Effect - Engineering to this popular learning zone. Through hands on interactives, children learn the foundational tools they need to prepare for school and the work of tomorrow. Popular exhibit components include Programming Art, Circuit Bench, Rigamajig, Keva Planks, Spectrum Light Lab, and Pulleys, all designed to teach the basic scientific principles behind cause and effect.

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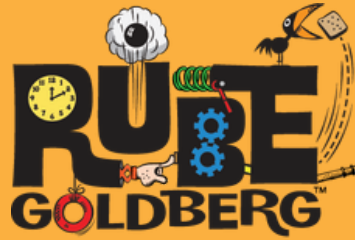
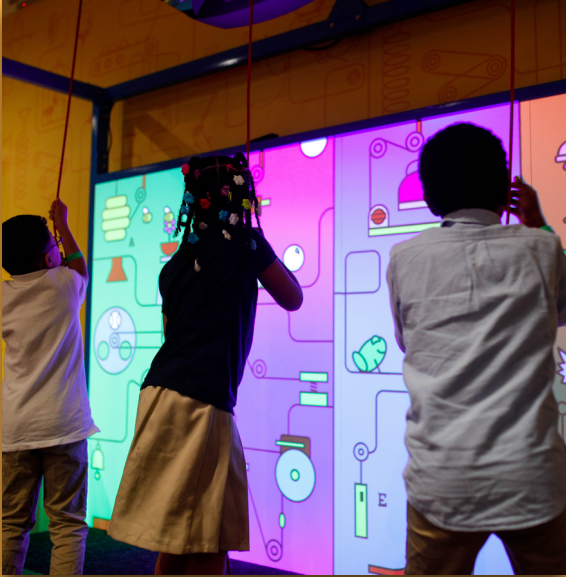

Rube Goldberg™: The World of Hilarious Invention! showcases Pulitzer Prize-winning humorist and inventor Rube Goldberg™'s iconic contraptions, imaginative illustrations, and humorous storytelling, celebrating his skills as both an artist and inventor.

Inspired by Rube's original illustrations and inventive storytelling, this exhibit contains a collection of new 3D, life-size machines and hands-on, interactive components that connect Rube's iconic cartoon contraptions to the way things work in the physical world. These experiences provide insight into the legacy of Rube and how classic engineering principles can be re-imagined as entry points for deeper exploration of STEAM concepts for 21st-century learning.



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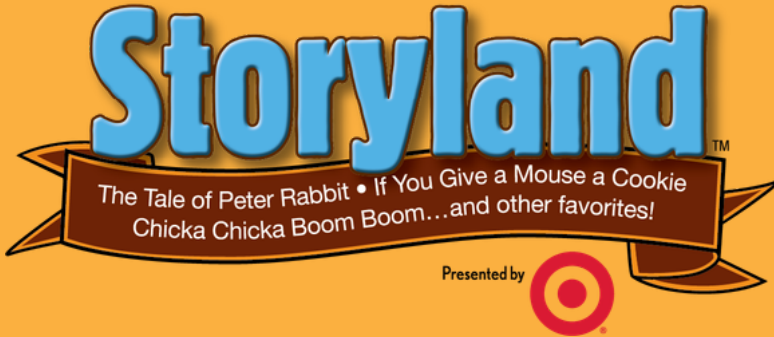

Storyland: A Trip Through Childhood Favorites™ provides imaginative, book-based experiences for children ages birth - 8 years old. Storyland transforms seven beloved books - "The Tale of Peter Rabbit" by Beatrix Potter; "The Snowy Day" by Ezra Jack Keats; "Where's Spot?" by Eric Hill; "If You Give a Mouse a Cookie" by Laura Numeroff; "Chicka Chicka Boom Boom" by Bill Martin Jr. and John Archambault; "Abuela" by Arthur Dorros; and "Tuesday" by David Wiesner into three-dimensional play and bi-lingual learning environments.

CMA continues to deliver exceptional arts and culture programming throughout the year with Celebrate! A Cultural Exploration and United Nations of Play.

Through support from the Institute of Museum and Library Sciences and Georgia Natural Gas, CMA provides high-quality virtual learning experiences to young children across Georgia. In partnership with Georgia State University, metro Atlanta schools, and rural school systems across the state, CMA is providing literacy programming and contributing to an academic body of knowledge on how to develop, execute, assess, and improve digital learning curriculum.
